The Door

Sophisticates and fundamentalists share a common need. Pantheists and atheists are no different. Middle of the roaders and Mormon hoarders are ultimately linked. It doesn't matter whether you consider yourself rural, urban, suburban, subtropical, tropical, topical, scriptural, evangelical, liberal, generous, blessed, cursed, well-versed, musical, logical, rational, sensational, ordinary, or extra ordinary. At some point all of us and each of us will face *the door*.

Some of us (and quite possibly most of us) will attempt to avoid the door. A few of us will simply dismiss it as irrelevant. Others will see it as archaic. The critics will criticize it for being too flimsy, too narrow, and too provincial. Of course others will automatically call it too imperial. Even if some of us risk approaching the door, the temptation to play ding dong ditch or ring and run, can be overwhelming.

Then there are those of us who are quite satisfied by pulling up a chair and spending our days taking the door in. We comment, "Majesty! That door is simply majesty," and "How great is our door!" A big smile will come across our face when one of our numbers becomes an expert on the door and tells us stories of the door's history. We'll get all excited when the door's dimensions are spelled out and its composition analyzed.

This latter group will be offended when others in our company point their fingers at it and laugh, or curse it and extend the infamous digit of defiance. Whether it's due to this rejection or to some distorted attraction, there will be many who will choose to make doors of their own—doors in name, doors they can market, but ultimately doors that are nothing more than well-adorn walls.

The door remains. It remains unchanged by our responses to it. It remains available as the passageway for any and all who want to enter through it. It remains vigilant to keep out any and all who seek to corrupt it and those it welcomes in. The door remains as the passageway from dead end to no end, and the door remains available to you. It's the focus of John 10:1-10. It's worth giving it a try before you knock it!

Start Planning for Dundee Camp

Colon Cancer Awareness

Colorectal cancer is the third most common cancer in men and women. There is a 96% cure rate when caught early, but in early stages, there may be no symptoms. Risks are greater for those over 50 and those with family history of colon cancer.
